# **RABBI'S REFLECTIONS**

ften when I sit with couples where one person is choosing Judaism, I laugh when they tell me they took their non-Jewish partner to High Holy Days services to introduce them to our religion. What??? I know I am supposed to be in "awe" of these important days on our calendar, but if that were the kind of introduction I would have to Judaism, I would go running for the hills (and I am a rabbi).

Don't get me wrong, I love love love the community feeling that brings us all together over the holidays. I love the moments during Rosh Hashanah & Yom Kippur where we get to interact and laugh together, I love watching our students schmooze and spend time together, and I love the moments where we can all sing together. But, in terms of the totality of services, it is the time where I feel the greatest divide between rabbi and congregant. Many are very comfortable with the extreme gap between that what is preached from the pulpit and how one conducts themselves in their daily life. However, this gap can translate to a waste of resources, time, and energy and it is felt most by synagogue professionals during this time of year. We spend four months preparing for these three days on the Jewish calendar only to have many of you walking away from the experience wondering why you sat so long.

To truly understand the High Holy Day service, you almost have to go to rabbinical school. It is a complex and complicated weaving of biblical verses and ideas, ancient poetry, and symbolism that requires an extensive knowledge of Judaism. Our new machzorim (High Holy Day prayer books) do a beautiful job of explaining the liturgy but even then, can you really have an uplifting spiritual experience while you are trying to figure out what is being recited?

Ultimately, these are important days. However, they need to be important days for the Judaism YOU practice and connect with. I want this significant time on our calendar to be meaningful for the weekly Shabbat attendee as much as the one who sees their Judaism in blintzes, latkes, and matzah ball soup. I want those of you who find walking on the beach to be your most spiritual experience to find a place in our tradition during Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Most importantly, I want your Judaism to be meaningful throughout the entirety of the year and not just during 10 days on our calendar.

So, my pledge to you as we approach this amazing season and new synagogue year is that we will work hard to speak to you, your soul, your Judaism. We have plans this season for amazing learning, for fun, for innovation, for beautiful music, for lots of laughter, for social action, for community, and for the acknowledgement that our tradition has survived 4000 years because there are millions of entry points to find a Judaism that speaks to you. At CTJ that means no judgment, no constraints, and no guilt. We can't wait to celebrate a New Year together... it is a magical moment to stop and recognize we are alive, we are blessed, and we are a thriving Jewish institution in the South Bay. Wishing you and yours a very happy and healthy 5784!

We go to a body of water and symbolically cast off the sins of the past year into the water to start the New Year with purity of heart. However, this is not the only time humans cast their "sins" into the sea. Every year, approximately

six million tons of human-made trash enter the water, posing health and safety hazards to the animals that call the sea their home. For the second year, CTJ Sisterhood will add a modern ritual to the Jewish tradition: a local clean-up known as Reverse Tashlich. Meet in the parking lot. We'll hand out trash bags and gloves and proceed north to clean up trash from this well-used beach and help our coastal environment! Sign up form coming soon.

# **OHREN EDUCATION CENTER (OEC)** Welcome to an OEC year bursting like bagels, not bubbles

ne may say that time, being linear, is like a six-foot party sub: a long, straight progression from January to December. But those well-acquainted with the Jewish calendar understand it to be more like a bagel: round, cyclical, familiar, and – if we're doing things right – absolutely bursting with tasty fillings.

Why else should we use a bagel as a symbol for 5784? Because it's an enduring symbol of Jewish-American culture. It's just as tasty as the round challah that we usually eat on Rosh Hashanah, but more easy to find at OEC throughout the school year. Plus, this year's muti-Oscar-winning movie, 'Everything, Everywhere, All at Once' turned the humble bagel into a profound metaphor, but in the OEC we'd like to go with less existential crisis and more lox. And finally, I'm from New York - my great grandparents were part of the great bagel migration from Eastern Europe in the late 19th/early 20th century, so I have eaten the best bagels ever - the NYC bagel for my entire life.

In any case, the real question for this time of year isn't about the subject of Rabbi Kalev's High Holy Day sermons, but rather: "Where can I get a bagel at OEC this year?" and "What can I fill it with?"

Here are only a few of our "full-filling" opportunities happening in the OEC this fall:

- OEC Classes Kick-Off on Sunday, September 10th from 9am-12pm: Our OEC year kicks-off with K-7 classes, promising many warm welcomes, smiles, and laughs. Bagels will be served to all our students! =)
- 2. A New Year at the Point also on Sunday, September 10th from 1-2pm: The fun doesn't end on Sunday, September 10th with OEC class dismissal! At 1pm, we'll celebrate the New Year at the Point with a Bubbleologist! See science and bubbles come together in a sudsy demonstration. Bubbles will pop, like our previous years wrongdoings disappearing into thin air. And bubbles will float up into the

sky, carrying with them our hopes and dreams for 5784. Be a part of this extraordinary celebration, where learning meets laughter, where science meets symbolism, and where the New Year meets a clean and clear beginning.

- 3. OEC Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur Programming: After our first day, you'll notice a pause in our Sunday classes on September 17 and 24. Mark your calendars for Saturday, September 16 for OEC Rosh Hashanah programming and Monday, September 25 for OEC Yom Kippur programming; we promise, it's going to be as exhilarating as the Shofar blasts!
- 4. OEC Sukkot Celebration on Sunday, October 1st from 11am-12pm (during regular OEC class time): We're hosting a Sukkot Celebration for all our OEC families and the community - parents, siblings, friends please celebrate with us. Our kids won't just learn about Ushpizin; they're inviting you to BE the Ushpizin!
- 5. OEC Simchat Torah Celebration & Keedum on Sunday, October 8th from 9:30-10:30am: Get ready to dance all morning and unroll the Torah at our Simchat Torah Celebration. We'll also celebrate our 3rd grade students and the beginning of their Hebrew studies, literally surrounding them in Torah and Hebrew.
- 6. OEC 3rd 7th Grade Retreat from October 27-29, 2023: Three days of thrilling activities, bonding, and immersive Jewish learning, with the only survival skills needed being how to perfectly roast a marshmallow. Note that K-2 will meet at CTJ for regular classes on Sunday and take-over the building.

So there you have it: our new year at OEC and the start of 5784, as round and full as a perfectly bursting bagel. Not like those bubbles bursting into thin air. It's a fall season layered with education and excitement.

In the meantime, stay cool, stay kosher, and remember: your bagel, like this next year, is ready to be filled with whatever you choose!






